Council Update: Quality child care a product of vital partnerships in Palm Beach County

Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County (CSC) is working hard through its quality improvement system and funding so that Palm Beach County children have access to high-quality child care. Through its partnership with the Early Learning Coalition of Palm Beach County (ELC), which administers child care subsidies and scholarships, CSC provided child care assistance to more than 9,000 children last year, staff informed the Council at its monthly meeting. Without these scholarships, many parents of young children would be unable to work or go to school. Statewide, 27.6 percent of children (up to age 5) receive help paying for child care. In Palm Beach County, that number jumps to 33.5 percent because of CSC funding. To read more, click here.
