In celebration of National Mentoring Month, the latest episode of the *Growing Up Strong* television series will focus on mentoring. The 30-minute show produced by the Childrens Services Council of Palm Beach County will air on WXEL on **Monday, Jan. 11, at 5:30 p.m.** and again on **Monday, Jan. 18, at noon.** A mentor can open up a childs eyes to new worlds of opportunity, while providing a steady influence. At-risk high school students assigned mentors are 55 percent more likely to attend college, according to a recent national survey. In Palm Beach County, there are about 1,900 children waiting for a caring mentor to become part of their lives. The *Growing Up Strong* show will feature how one child who participated in a mentoring program in Palm Beach County went on to become a dean at a local high school and a mentor himself.
