Council Update: CSC Served More than 52,000 Children, Families in 23-24

About 52,600 Palm Beach County children and their families benefited from early intervention and prevention services funded by Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County in fiscal year 2023-2024. Of those, more than 32,000 participated in quality child care, afterschool programs and summer camps through CSC scholarship and match funding, an increase of more than 3,300 children from the previous year.
