INTERESTED IN CREATING A POCKET REFUGE FOR YOUR COMMUNITY?

Within the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), Loxahatchee's Urban Community Engagement team works with the National Wildlife Refuge Association (NWRA) to partner with local organizations to establish pocket refuges in nearby communities. The diagram below outlines the respective responsibilities of each partner when collaborating on a Pocket Refuge.
