Clerk of the Circuit Court & Comptroller's Operation Green Light starts March 28

The Clerk of the Circuit Court & Comptroller's annual Operation Green Light event is March 28 through April 1. Operation Green Light started with our office in 2014 and has since been adopted by Clerk's offices statewide. During the event, anyone with outstanding traffic tickets or other court fines and fees will have their collection agency fees waived. The original fine and any late fees must still be paid. Council Update: CSC-funded programs meet challenges under difficult circumstances

Staff of Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County completed the Annual Comprehensive Program Performance Assessment (CPPA) of funded programs and shared results with the Council's board at its most recent meeting. CPPA is one of several tools used during the contract year to assess the performance of individual programs, evaluate the extent to which programs are helping families reach their goals and identify opportunities for improvement. Of the 28 maternal/child health programs contracted to provide direct services to children and families: 21 achieved high fidelity, meaning they were implemented as intended, and 7 achieved moderate fidelity; 21 achieved intended outcomes, 3 achieved moderate outcomes and 4 achieved low outcomes.
