The VRC also offers Veterans the opportunity to take a warm shower, obtain clothing from our donated clothing closet, do laundry and, when available, obtain non-perishable groceries and toiletries.

Healthcare for Homeless Veterans (HCHV) Programs


Vision

To end Veteran homelessness by assisting willing participants in the continuum of services offered at the West Palm Beach VA Medical Center and in the community utilizing treatment and case management services.

Eligibility

One or more of the following criteria must be met:

- Veteran must be VA eligible.
- Veteran is without adequate housing, currently homeless, or at-risk for homelessness.
- Veteran is without adequate income and resources for independent living.
- Veteran has need for medical, mental health, or substance abuse services.
- Veteran is willing to obtain assistance from the VA.

Reaching Out to Homeless Veterans



The Healthcare for Homeless Veterans (HCHV) Programs at the West Palm Beach VA Medical Center offer a wide range of outpatient services for homeless Veterans and Veterans at-risk for homelessness. Our team consists of social workers who engage in community outreach in parks, soup kitchens, halfway houses, etc, identifying homeless Veterans and offering assistance as indicated. Veterans may drop

in at the Veterans Resource Center (VRC), which is located in Building 16 on the West Palm Beach VA Medical Center grounds.

After a thorough assessment, Veterans may receive assistance with immediate referrals through existing VA programs or with community providers. The HCHV programs also provide indirect services to homeless Veterans through community networking

and partnerships in local and rural areas. Indirect services may include, but are not limited to, assistance with Palm Tran applications, referrals to community food pantries, low-income housing, assistance with utilities when funding is available, and referrals for emergency placement or detoxification from substances.
