| Report on Caregiving Youth in the U.S. | Progress and Opportunity | December 2023

Members of the Caregiving Youth Research Collaborative (CYRC), representing eight states across the country, have compiled and are releasing a White Paper, culminating months of collaborative writing. The CYRC's leadership is by Dr. Betsy Olson of the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, and Dr. Connie Siskowski, in collaboration with the American Association of Caregiving Youth (AACY) and its Caregiving Youth Institute.

The paper focuses on three key areas relating to this growing population of children and teens who sacrifice their own educational opportunities, health, well-being, and childhood to provide care for family or household members who are chronically ill, injured, frail, and/or have disabilities. These three areas are **research, practice, and policy**.

In a joint statement about the White Paper, Olson and Siskowski say, "It is not only the result of months of collaborative writing, but it also lays a foundation to move forward on behalf of this otherwise hidden population who contributes unpaid labor and plays a crucial role in the healthcare of individuals of all

ages."

The concluding recommendations of the White Paper are:

- Form a national task force on Caregiving Youth.
- Conduct a national prevalence and impact study.
- Support access to resources and existing successful programs to provide support for this otherwise neglected population.
