- The One-Penny Sales Surtax will be allocated as follows: Schools 50%, County 30% and Cities 20%
- Independent Citizen Committees to audit spending compliance
- Tourists pay approximately 25% of the tax
- · One-Penny Sales Surtax for 10 years, by law ends on or before December 31. 2026
- \$6 billion economic impact over 15 years
- Creates an estimated 46.000 permanent and temporary jobs

- Transactions subject to state sales tax
- First \$5,000 of sales price of single personal property
