Caps and Crips Teen Mentorship Program Expands to Support Teen Moms

Healthy Mothers, Healthy Babies Coalition of Palm Beach County's Caps & Cribs Teen Mom Mentoring program is expanding it's support for young mothers in Palm Beach County! Since the program's inception, only pregnant or parenting teens enrolled in high school were eligible to receive mentoring support. Now, young moms residing in Palm Beach County are eligible to be a Caps & Cribs mentee for one year after graduation. Transitioning out of high school is a major change, and this expansion of mentoring eligibility will fill the gap to ensure young mothers have the support they need as they begin their new journey at college or in their career while caring for their child.
